





City of Coolidge ~ In Memory of Bill Borgards

The City of Coolidge sadly lost one of our members of the Development Services team to a battle with the COVID-19 Virus in March 2021. William "Bill" Borgards was employed as the Code Enforcement Officer for the City of Coolidge. Originally from Nicaragua, his family immigrated to the United States when he was nine years old. Bill always had the desire to help people and contribute to his community. He began a law enforcement career as a reserve police officer with the Ontario Police Department in 1973. He would eventually get hired with LAPD in 1980 after attending a six-month police academy. At the time he was only one of 135 applicants to be selected out of a pool of more than 3,500 applicants. He was always very proud of his achievements and career with LAPD. He would later work in law enforcement with The Tribal Police in Highland CA and also the Rialto School District. Bill and his wife moved to Coolidge as a place to retire, but he continued to want to be involved in the community. In March 2019 while at City Hall getting a few documents notarized, he was encouraged to apply for the newly created Code Enforcement position. He proudly served in that position taking on and accepting the challenges of responding to complaints and educating the public about the importance of maintaining the appearances of properties around the City. He was very successful at working with the Citizens and property owners and helping to make the City a better place.

Bill was a great man who is deeply missed by staff and the community.
