On June 5th 2017, the Grand Canyon Chapter presented a training on "Tiny Homes". This well attended ICC preferred provider training offered a multidisciplinary approach to permitting and inspecting Tiny Homes. Subjects included tiny homes and the I-Codes, planning and zoning for tiny homes, jurisdictional and ADEQ sanitary system requirements, tiny homes and the real estate market, and Coconino County's groundbreaking policy on permitting of tiny homes as well as their Sustainable Building Program.

In the afternoon a roundtable discussion with participation by Coconino County, ADOT and the Office of Manufactured Housing allowed attendees to ask questions and provided an opportunity for an in-depth discussion of those questions.



Press Release from Building Officials Association of Florida, House Bill 909 BUILDING OFFICIALS PROPOSE BILL TO ATTRACT GEN Y AND GEN Z

Sanford, Fla, March 15, 2017 - As Florida's economy grows, construction projects increase and current building code compliance personnel come closer to retirement, the Building Officials Association of Florida (BOAF) is proactively seeking ways to attract younger applicants to this career.

This might be a great way to While most people certified to work in these jobs have years of experience, success in this field is also achieved with a combination of the love for the science behind the building codes, focused training, standard examination and evaluation. To create an environment for success, BOAF's building official members are proposing an internship program that will provide the next generation with much needed competent building code inspectors and plans examiners.

To facilitate this internship path, BOAF has proposed legislation in HB 909 that will authorized the Building Code Administrators and Inspectors Board (BCAIB) to create the guidelines for an internship path to certification, as well as addressing other related changes that will benefit the construction industry.

Specifically, HB 909 provides for the following changes:

- Adds language that clarifies that a building official for one jurisdiction has the same authority 1. provided by statute when working as a relief building official for another jurisdiction under an interlocal agreement.
- Creates a Residential Plans Examiner definition and certification category. 2.
- 3. Creates an internship application category as a path to certification that would include:
 - · Employment with a sponsoring authority having jurisdiction.
 - Passing grade on state examination in category sought prior to starting internship.
 - Passing grade on principles and practices examination prior to completing internship.
 - Structured formal training (40 hours).
 - · Specialized on-the-job training as determined by sponsoring building official.
 - Internship period from one to four years depending on verified education and/or experience.
 - Be eligible for provisional status certification when recommended by sponsoring building official.
 - Strikes language to clarify eligibility that provisional inspector or plans examiner status is not limited
- to newly hired or promoted employees.
- Authorizes BCAIB to accept a comparable ICC examination from another state. 5.
- Adds building code administrator to the list of entities that can perform services as a private б. provider.

The internship program combines experience and/or education, structured training, examinations, individualized advanced training, and evaluation under the supervision and direction of an appointed AHJ building official. http://boaf.net/default.asp?page=PR_HB909#.WTirnFj2bv4.mailto
